## PRACTICAL INFO

## Public transportation

The conference venue, the campus area can be best reached via Tram 1, which connects the Main Railway Station, and the city center with the campus area, take off at the Egyetem tér stop (University square stop), which is 50 meters from the main building. A single ticket costs 300 HUF , if you buy it in advance; but you can buy it on the tram, in this case a single ticket costs $\mathbf{4 0 0}$ HUF.

## Walking

The walking distance between the center and the campus is around $\mathbf{3 0 - 4 0}$ minutes, follow tram line n. 1 .

## Private transportation

There are several cab-companies running in the city of Debrecen. A trip from the Main Railway Station to the Life Sciences Building should cost you no more than 3000 HUF. We recommend you the following ones: Fönix Taxi (+36 $\mathbf{5 2} \mathbf{4 4 4} \mathbf{4 4 4 )}$ City Taxi (+36 52555 555)

Money exchange
ATMs can be found at several places both in the city centre and in the campus area (Main Building, entrance area). The unit of currency in Hungary is the Hungarian Forint (HUF). Foreign currency can be easily exchanged at banks or exchange offices. Visa and Master cards are widely accepted. Few shops accept Euro banknotes as well. There are several exchange offices at the city center, and at Kálvin square.
